1 CHAIR'S OPENING REMARKS

The Chair opened the meeting by welcoming members.

2. MINUTES of the AGM held on 3rd November 2015 Matters Arising – none

3. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman's report summarised the Society's actions and achievements over the previous 12 months, full report attached.

4. SECRETARY'S REPORT

All trustees agreed to stand for a further term, and Charles Ferris was also appointed a Trustee. Simon James was co-opted as an advisor, with his particular interest to monitor the Facebook activity.

8. A.O.B. POLICING

PC Simon James explained the current policing situation regarding illegal off roading and Anti-social behaviour. There is now a move within the Police and Authorities taking a wider view.

Les Murphy again suggested that we pursue funding to set up a Ranger scheme to patrol the area ourselves, and not rely on police or council employees. It has already been mentioned that the Society could have some projects 'in waiting' for councils to support if they were found to have a 'spare' bit of money at the end of the year, Norman Liversuch said RDP money should allow us to do this.

The Chair thanked members for attending. He emphasised that the work of the Society was far from complete, and he encouraged our newly elected Trustees to take us into the New Year with the expectation of several new projects for us to embrace.
