PAST GOOD FRIDAYS

I've been scanning in negatives of mine from the 1960s and 70s and came across a few from Good Friday 1971 - they are rubbish quality but they were developed by myself under the bed sheets.

But they do show that back then plenty of people clambered to the top of the Twmp on Good Friday and had a great day out up there.

The photos show that there was no damage to the slopes leading up to the Twmp, there were no steps up the side of the Twmp (they were added in the mid 1980s) and that some commoners kept their ponies out on the hillside too.

I won't be going up there myself this year which will be the first time for me to miss the event in an awful long time.



Can I suggest that instead of making the walk this year why don't you dig out some of your old photos of the event and post them online or send them to me to add to our gallery.

Have you got any photos older than mine - I'd love to see them.
