### 4. Chairman's Report

- 4.1 The Chair provided a summary of his report and summarised some of the Society's achievements over the previous 12 months which included:
  - The successful completion of the Tidy Twmp project using £24,000 funding from the Welsh Government's Tidy Towns initiative for work to deter anti-social behaviour, to prevent fly tipping, widen public access to the Tump and provide signage. Society members had erected over a kilometre of fencing, planted 4,000 trees and laid 20 metres of stone pathway.
  - Chris Evans MP, Jocelyn Davies AM and Gwyn Price AM had attended a tree planting ceremony to mark the completion of the project.

9.1 PC Simon James reported that as a result of his regular patrols and CTS activity, there was less off-road activity at Twm Barlwm because the problem had been displaced elsewhere. He noted that the first successful prosecution for flytipping at Twm Barlwm had recently taken place.

### 10. Chair's Closing Remarks

10.1 The Chair thanked members for attending. He emphasised that the work of the Society was far from complete as the Tidy Twmp work would need to be consolidated and other areas of the Society's Mission Statement such as archaeology, recording flora and fauna and surveys had been under-developed. He also referred to the potential for CTS to work in partnership with other organisations and stakeholders such as the campaign to prevent permanent closure of the Cwmcarn Forest Drive. The key to the future success of the Society would be the extent to which it engaged with the community and received the active support of its members.
