- 1.1 None
- 2. Minutes of Trustees' Meeting held on 1 December 2014 and Matters Arising
- 2.1 The minutes of the meeting held on 1 December 2014 were agreed.

- 3.1 TE reported that:

5. ORPA, Commoners and Funding for Future Projects

- 5.1 LM said that CCBC had two sources of funding for work to protect pedestrian access and restrict illegal access to Common Land, Money under one grant scheme had to be spent by 1 April 2015; while spending under the other grant scheme could be phased over three years. Following discussion it was agreed:
 - not to pursue funding to replace the cattle grid as CCBC would pay for this
 - to seek £2k funding for a loadable barrier to tie in with the "Corral" and make it more inconvenient for off-road vehicles
 - to see if CCBC would allow a joint bid from CTS and the Commoners to pre-order some of the 320 block stones (@ £200 each) which would be used to demarcate footpaths
 - that SE/TE/DP and LM would meet CCBC to discuss possible projects

6. Events

 - · a biodiversity bash at the end of May
 - · the Good Friday Hot Cross Bun Walk on 25 March
 - RS would be arranging a farms walk and a talk by Ray Howell.
