2. Minutes of Trustees' Meeting held on 11 May 2015 and Matters Arising

2.1 The minutes of the meetings held on 11 May 2015 were agreed.

2.2 Matters Arising

Blocking stones - NL said that Phil Griffiths has a meeting with the Commoners to discuss funding out of NRW budget

Cattle Grid – tenders are in, and work scheduled to begin end of June

Scoping Study – CCBC & Torfaen have no opposition to Public Launch, they are looking for grant from NRW to help launch.

It was suggested that CTS could offer to 'host' the launch, SE to contact Phil Griffiths and NL will mention it when he sees him.

Policing – Phil Griffiths says the policy is to keep Simon James, but not with vehicles to catch off-roaders, but tackling them by other means,

4. Events

- 4.1 SEWBREC/Gwent Wildlife have confirmed they are to do a Recorders Day on Saturday 22nd August, SE to meet with Amy Hicks for a site visit to help identify suitable areas. They will promote the event, with us to support via our Website and F/B
- 4.2 RS agreed to lead Walk on Sunday 5th July from the carpark to Llanderfel Monastic Chapel.

Also, on 2nd August a Lost Farms Walk, starting at the Visitors Centre, taking in The Rhyswg, The Glyn, and Ffynnon y Carn, and back to the Visitors Centre.

8. Campaign to Save Cwmcarn Forest Drive

8.1 RS stated that they had started work above Carpark 1, and felling with chainsaws at the present, before the bigger machinery was deployed.

RS is monitoring areas that raised concern for conservation, such as Pwll Tra and the Farmsteads ruins, and has sent a letter listing his concerns to NRW.
