Dave Parry told the meeting that Gethin had already made progress sourcing stones, and obtaining quotes for walling, sending contractors to look at tree removal etc. The boulders and stonedust and chippings were due to be delivered to Howard Vicary.

We discussed adding to the shopping list of works the 'Coralling' idea of a double gate system at the car park, as an option if the proposed closure of the ORPA is refused, or is likely to take a significant time to resolve. Gethin is due to meet with Andrew Osborne to discuss Torfaen's intentions.
