This will be given by the ITV cameraman Jerry Cross who was involved with documenting the Ship's excavation and conservation throughout the last 12 years. He will be recalling these special events with us by sharing his film "Caught in a Storm".

It is thought that the Men-at-Arms who also came together at Tretower may well have marched south to Newport to take ship rather than march, and we anticipate an event in Newport in July 2015 to mark this event.
