1. MINUTES of Trustees' Meeting held on Monday 14th May 2022

2. THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE BEACON (Thursday 2nd June 2022.)

With the collaboration of 1st Abercarn Scouts, St Johns Ambulance, Risca Branch, and South Wales Fire and Rescue, Risca Station, we had up to 100 people on the Mountain to celebrate the lighting of the Beacon. Chris Evans MP gave a speech, and a member of the Scouts lit the Beacon. The event was a great success, with a beautiful sunset and new Moon on the night. We were sent a Certificate of Participation from the Pageantmaster, which has been presented to all the groups, along with a donation from Risca Town Council. Thank you too to Mrs Sally Davies for the donation of £100 to CTS in recognition of out help with the event. (A full report is published on the Website)

3. ARCHAEOLOGY AND CADW

The Cadw funding is approved, and the Archaeology is scheduled to start on 8 August, for three weeks. The weekend of 13-14 August will be an outreach event to involve members of the public and interested groups. An 'Outreach Officer' will also be available for 8 days during the dig.

There will be a meeting on Monday 8th August at Risca Museum for a briefing from CPAT to the volunteers who wish to be involved. It is hoped that the Interim Report from the first dig may be available by then too

TE has been contacted by Cllr Nigel George, who thinks that they will look favourably at an application to cover the costs of the Carbon dating portion of the project through the Empowerment Grant. (Norman had made an application previously to cover the Bio-blitz)

It is planned for 10th or 11th September, Saturday or Sunday.
The meeting thanked Terry Evans for all the work he has put into this project.

The Path up from the Carpark is in dispute, Howard Vicary thinks it is OK, after a site visit, Gethin Bowes and NL say it is poorly done, and a worse state than before. NL will speak to Gethin again, when he is available.

These are the list of tasks which were suggested around Twmbarlwm and the two main tracks across the mountain.

I haven't got the full list of Twmbarlwm works with me at present but from memory it was:

- 1, Replacement knee rail and steps.
- 2, Repair and extend the floating paths.
- 3, Reseed bare soil/fire damage where required.
- 4, Repair and reseed scarring on Southern side of Twmbarlwm.
- 5, Repair footpath from car park.
- 6, Car park improvements
- 7, Double Barrier/corral
- 8, Repair to scarring/bike track on the common.
- 9, Drainage works on ORPA to prevent water running on to the highway.
- 10, Pond works -
- 11, Trig point project

(I'm sat on site typing this and am sure to have forgotten something!)

The first permissive bridleway/track will start from Twmbarlwm car park and run to the gas station with access to Cwmcarn. The second will start at Howard's sheep pen and run to the mountain air car park, meeting the first track in the middle of the common at the gas station.

We still have some work to do in terms of permissions and agreements for these works to go ahead but we hopefully won't encounter any significant delays.

We are not totally in agreement with the schemes proposed; there would be a big impact on local communities with the additional visitor numbers, and the current infrastructure would struggle to cope. Norman will write to NRW and CCBC.
